While a snowmobiler since 1972, Bill was too busy teaching Vo-Ag to get involved with his club activities. But after retiring in 1996, he soon became immersed in his new passion of trail grooming for the Northwest Colorado Snowmobile Club, and made up for lost time.

As a certified welder and top notch mechanic, these skills served him well in maintaining and operating the groomer and groomer program.

At 82 years young, and while most people that age are relaxing, Bill is still very active snowmobiling, club activities, club Board of Director since 1995, volunteering for many club activities and local civic events, training new groomer operators and grooming the Club Trails on Routt National Forest.
